

KENDRA KANNEGAARD

-DIRECTOR

Welcome to **Hadestown: Teen Edition!**(I can't believe I finally get to say that!)

This director's note is long-please indulge me. I've waited a very, very long time for this moment.

From the first time I heard those iconic opening notes, I knew I needed to do this show at SVHS. I've waited (somewhat more patiently than Eurydice) for the rights to be released, always promising myself: the second they're available, this is the one.

This show has been a part of my heart for almost a decade. The original Off-Broadway recording was the soundtrack I used for my long commutes and late-night study sessions. I made friends and strangers listen to it daily in the green room at San Jose State. I even wrote about it in one of my Teaching Credential application essays. **Hadestown** was my comfort music and my anthems, and it somehow wove its way into all the most important parts of my life.

Luke and I included lyrics from the show in our wedding vows, and a big neon sign that reads "Till the end of time" now hangs in our living room. (I promise I'm only slightly obsessed with this show.)

On April 23, 2024, Concord Theatricals announced the release of Hadestown: Teen Edition. I was in the middle of teaching an English class, completely unaware that this life-changing news had just dropped. But Milo knew. He somehow convinced his teacher to let him leave class and burst into my room, breathless, to tell me. We screamed and we cried (a little) in front of a very confused English 1 class. I gave them a quick break so I could do the only logical thing in that moment—apply for the license immediately.

I didn't find out we were approved until May 13th, just one day after Milo passed away.

It was a devastating, heartbreaking moment. The timing felt cruel and impossible to comprehend. It was as if Milo had somehow sent us a final gift. But the realization that we would be doing the show without him felt unbearable.

After speaking with his incredible parents and closest friends, we came to an important understanding: we wouldn't truly be doing the show without him. He would just be part of it in a different way.

And I believe we've honored that as best we could.

KENDRA KANNEGAARD

-DIRECTOR

There are little Milo touches woven all throughout this production—from **Station M** to **Milo's Speakeasy Bar**, and most meaningfully, his headshot, sitting proudly atop the piano in the bar. It's the best seat in the house, where he can watch his friends perform and still be part of the show, just as he was always meant to be.

Telling my students that this was the show we'd get to do this year is a moment I'll never forget. There were tears (happy/sad), laughter, and a million questions—How are we going to pull this off? Thankfully, I have the most amazing team in the world.

This has been our most technically advanced production yet: rotating turntable, haze machines, a working elevator, and more musical numbers and choreography than anything we've attempted before. It's ambitious, it's bold, and it's been built with so much love. Which is exactly what this show is about love in all its forms. Romantic love, sacrificial love, lost love that yearns to be found, and the love that outlasts even death. It asks: how far would you go for the person you love most?

The music reaches straight into your soul. Anaïs Mitchell somehow captures longing in a melody—that aching feeling in your chest when you miss someone so deeply you'd give anything for just one more moment. Every time Orpheus sings "Waaaaait for me," while the workers echo his refrain, I'm a sobbing wreck. This production means more to us than I can ever truly explain. It's layered with memories—of Milo, of my wedding, and of the people I love most. Every decision in this show has been made with care, every note sung with heart, every movement choreographed with intention. Because at the end of the day, **Hadestown** is a love song.

This process hasn't been easy. The technical challenges were daunting-shoutout to Cooper, Asher, Colburn, Leo, and Luke, who all learned skills I'm pretty sure none of them expected to pick up while working in high school theatre. We're also the first group in the county to perform it, which is both incredibly thrilling and mildly terrifying.

Also-surprise!—I've been pregnant throughout this entire rehearsal process! It's been a lot. But I wouldn't change a second of it. Every challenge has been met with determination, passion, and a deep love for this show and this drama family that we've built. I'm beyond proud of what we've created together. This cast, this crew, this family—they mean everything to me.

Theatre is a collaborative art form, and this show was truly a family affair, so I would be remiss if I didn't take the time to thank some very important people:

The Milo Anima Legacy Fund has been set up through the Community Foundation of Santa Cruz County for just this purpose.


The funds raised will be used to continue his legacy as an actor and activist; for example by buying equipment for the SVHS Drama Department, providing scholarships to QYLA, etc.




